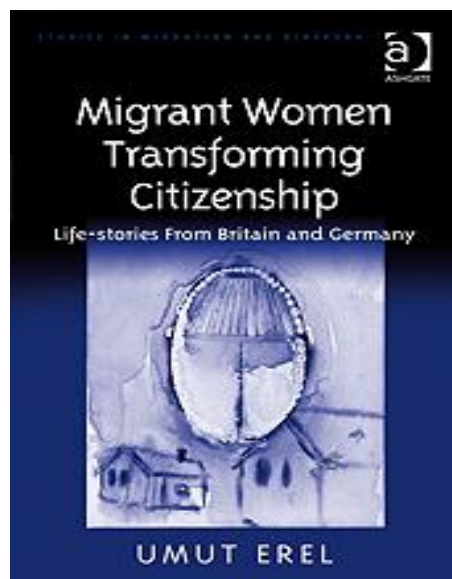

Erel's book introduces a much needed comparative perspective, exploring ways in which diverging concepts and policies of citizenship allow for differentiated examination of ethnicity, gender, multiculturalism and citizenship in Europe.
