



London Design and Engineering UTC (LDEUTC) Progression Scholarship – 2018/19 Entry

Background

As a proud founding member of the London Design and Engineering UTC, UEL has developed an enhanced package of benefits for LDEUTC students who wish to start an undergraduate degree at UEL in September 2018. The package has been designed to recognise and reward students' achievements and support their progress towards achieving their career and life goals.

The key features of the package are:

- A guaranteed offer or interview for students taking appropriate level 3 qualifications
- Automatic consideration for our early unconditional offer scheme
- The opportunity to apply directly to UEL rather than via UCAS
- A guaranteed cash scholarship of £1,500 - £2,500 dependent on students' profile and performance (see below for criteria)

Also, as a student at UEL, students will receive free e-books for all their core modules and a free professional development certificate to evidence their skills to employers.

What is the UTC Progression Scholarship Scheme?

There are three categories of scholarship: Standard, Gold and Platinum. All LDE UTC students are eligible for the Standard (£1,500) Scholarship. To be considered for the Gold (£2,000) and Platinum (£2,500) Scholarships, students will need to complete a consent form giving LDE UTC permission to share their profile data with UEL. This will be sent to students once they have firmly accepted their offer from UEL.



Criteria

The criteria for each scholarship award is provided in the table below. Students need to meet a minimum of three out of four of the criteria to qualify.

Students will only be able to apply for an award if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Fee assessed as home/EU student
- Progressing directly from LDEUTC
- Applied and firmly accepted their offer at UEL before 30 June 2018
- Starting a full time undergraduate degree at UEL at foundation year or year 1
- Studying at one of our campuses or on distance learning programmes with fees of £9,250 per year
- Starting an undergraduate degree for the first time at UEL in September 2018

1. Excludes those studying:

- With a course with one of our collaborative partner
- Via online or distance learning with fees under £9,250
- In receipt of NHS funding
- In receipt of the ELSEF (Federation) Scholarship



Application process

2. Students do not need to apply for the scholarship scheme. Students who meet the criteria above will be assessed under the different categories.
3. The Scholarship will be confirmed once you have firmly accepted your admission offer. All communications will be sent by email.
4. Successful students will only be allowed to hold **one** UTC Progression award.
5. Student in receipt of the ELSEF (Federation) Scholarship are not eligible to receive the UTC Progression Scholarship.

Payment details

6. Awarded students will receive a payment in to their chosen bank account. We will request the student's bank details once successful students have fully enrolled.
7. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure the bank details they provide to the University are correct. Incorrect bank details may cause delays in payment. If bank details have not been provided by the end of the first term, the award will be cancelled without further warning.
8. Payment of the scholarship will be made in two instalments. Students should expect to receive the first instalment of the cash award via BACS after the third week of teaching at UEL.
9. The second instalment will only be paid if students have committed fully with the conditions of admittance, UEL's regulations including our attendance policy and the student code of conduct.
10. The scholarship payment will not be made if you have overdue debt to UEL, this includes not having Student Loans Company funding in place. Students have the option to have their scholarship transferred to cover/contribute to paying off the debt.



General terms and conditions

11. The scholarship will be paid in academic year 2018/19 and it will not be renewed or extended beyond this term to cover repeat modules or years.
12. Any scholarship awarded is subject to you successfully enrolling on a course at UEL in 2018/19 and committing to the full academic calendar.
13. If an awarded student decides to change programmes, the student will be entitled to keep the scholarship provided that the new course and mode of study meets the eligibility criteria. All changes must be approved by the Director of Student Recruitment and Marketing.
14. If an awardee student decides to withdraw, the scholarship will terminate at the date of withdrawal. Any payments made to the student will not need to be returned.
15. The scholarship cannot be exchanged for an alternative award.
16. The scholarship should be used in the year advertised. If a student defers their start date, the scholarship may be deferred for a maximum of one year at the discretion of the Scholarship team. If the student defers their start date for more than one year, they will no longer be eligible for the scholarship.
17. Once a period of study has commenced, should a scholarship holder suspend their studies through the proper channels, their scholarship is similarly suspended and will be recommenced on the resumption of studies.
18. If the student's status changes during their study, as a result of information not being provided at the point of application, and the student becomes ineligible, UEL reserves the right to revoke the scholarship and claim back any payments incorrectly made to you.
19. The UTC Progression Scholarship may not be held in conjunction with any other scholarships but does not limit eligibility to bursaries and discounts.
20. If a student breaks UEL regulations and is withdrawn from study, the scholarship will be immediately terminated and no further support will be available. If the student returns to study at a later date, the scholarship will not be re-awarded.
21. Students who are awarded a scholarship must commit to support the University with future promotion of UEL through ambassadorial works. This will be the equivalent of ten hours unpaid work for the university. Successful students will also, as a minimum, need to commit to a photo, testimonial profile and video testimonial promoting UEL.



22. UEL reserves the right to verify applications and request additional evidence.
23. If you are in receipt of welfare benefits and begin a course, money from scholarships and bursaries can affect your benefit entitlement as it may be treated as income. This depends on what the fund is intended to support you with, i.e. study related costs or living costs. Starting a course is a change of circumstance and you should inform all relevant benefit offices when you enrol.
24. A complaint is normally a specific concern related to a procedural error, irregularity, or maladministration in admissions procedures or policies.
