Updated the maximum number of modules that can be taken in an academic year to align with the 20-credit framework (paragraph 4.1.3). Reintroduced ability to top-up when returning to study removing requirement to apply APL for students who nearly completed their studies previously (paragraph 5.4).
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Removal of reference of the time limit to feedback to students to avoid duplicating the Assessment and Feedback Policy (paragraph 6.1.2). Included the lower credit requirement for pass-compensation to 80 credits allowing students to progress with 100 credits (where applicable) (paragraph 6.5.1). Clarified the maximum study load for a Postgraduate student per term (paragraph 8.1.4). Included a change in the credit limit for pass-compensation to 90 credits (reduced from 150 credits) (paragraph 10.7.1). Included information with regards to Apprenticeship students and End Point Assessments (paragraphs 6.9.2 & 10.8.2). Removed Terms of Reference for Assessment and Progression Boards and provide as a separate document to avoid duplication across policies and relocated. Transferred to standardised template.
